LOGLINE

After finding a large sum of money belonging to a guest found dead, a motel housekeeper's sense of dignity is put to the test, jeopardizing any chance she has of reuniting with her daughter.

SYNOPSIS - short

29 year-old Millie is a young, single mother working a mundane job as a housekeeper in a small town motel.

Her day consists of making the beds of others and cleaning up mess they leave behind. Millie soon discovers an opportunity to fix her own life when she decides to claim a bag of money belonging to a guest found dead. What choice will she make when faced with the inevitable consequences of her actions?



SYNOPSIS - long

Millie is a young, single mother working as a housekeeper in a small town motel.

Her job consists of cleaning up the mess that others leave behind, invisible to the guests that come in and out of the motel. One day, she finds a bag containing a large sum of money belonging to a dead guest. Against her conscience, she takes the money and hides it in an unoccupied room.

This causes Millie to be late for a birthday lunch with her teenage daughter Jamie, leaving Alice, her estranged mother-in-law, unimpressed. When Millie's attempts to reconnect with Jamie doesn't work, she resorts to giving her daughter a handful of the stolen money as a mean to buy her affection, raising suspicions to her path of recovery.

Millie will have to decide the road she needs to take in order to have the life with her daughter back.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

As a filmmaker, I find myself drawn towards the ideals of femininity, as well as the complexities of womanhood in my works. I owe my very being, of who I am today, to the family of women I grew up with.



My mother used to be a hairdresser; when she met my father, they got married and she became a stay-home housewife, taking care of three children. We were considered a lower middle class family, comfortable but learned to be careful with money, especially in a city that is obsessed with material progress. She would buy a lottery ticket every week – never huge bets – but when she wins a few hundred dollars, we would get to eat out at a restaurant. She was never on good terms with my father's mother who lived with us for a few years. They would get into loud quarrels and petty fights about everything. There were days when my mother would cry, as though it was all too much for her.

One night, after my mother dropped off the neighbor's kids, she took off.

No one was home except for me, my sisters and my grandmother. I was convinced she had decided to give up on us and very simply, chose to leave. I was angry, scared, and upset at her. Did we upset her? Was it grandma? Did she kill herself? How could she abandon us? I fell asleep on her bed, waiting for her to come home.

Going into this film, I wrote Millie based on a combination of people I've met, including my mother. Millie is a housekeeper whose job is to clean up rooms and the messes people leave behind, while at the same time she is doing plenty of housekeeping of her own. She has people she needs to answer to; the constant, tiring battles to show that she is a better mother and a better human being than she was before. But, ultimately, the most important person she needs to answer to, is herself.

When I woke up the next morning, my mother was laying next to me, getting ready for a new day. Maybe my mother was just taking a breather, but I never did find out where she went that night.

LEANA CHAVEZ | Millie



An Angeleno native, Leana is trained at the Gloria Gifford Conservatory for the Performing Arts.

She has since appeared in Oliver Stone's Savages and has guest starred on television series such as The Mentalist and 2 Broke Girls.

Leana plays the titular role of Millie, a young single mother working as a motel housekeeper.

She desperately attempts to redeem herself in order to secure a future with her teenage daughter When she finds a bag of money belonging to an unconscious guest that she presumed is dead, Millie makes the choice of stealing the money in hopes to impress the family she once had, but learns the only person she needs to answer to, is herself.





SUPPORTING CAST

GABRIELA FLORES | Jamie

Originally from McAllen, Texas, Gabriela moved to Los Angeles with her mother to pursue her passion in acting. She has appeared in various local theater productions as well as television commercials.

Gabriela plays Millie's young teenage daughter, Jamie. Having just turned 14, Jamie is at an age where there are things more important than being with family. Having gone through a difficult childhood, she's much more mature than girls her own age. She remains wary and cynical of her mother's sobriety but longs to have the life she used to have, back.



JEANETTE O'CONNOR | Alice



An accomplished television actress, Jeanette has appeared on a number of television series, such as *Criminal Minds*, New Girl, Brothers & Sisters, CSI and for films such as *Elizabethtown* and *What I Did For Love*.

Jeanette plays Alice, Millie's estranged mother-in-law. She holds a grudge against Millie for having ruined her family and is the legal guardian of her granddaughter, Jamie whom she protects dearly. Alice doesn't believe that Millie is capable of motherhood, and is suspicious when she gifts Jamie a huge sum of money that would not have been possible with her job cleaning motel rooms.

DEE BALDUS | Dorothy

Dee has guest starred in various popular television series such as *Parks and Recreation*, *Pretty Little Liars* and *Monks*. She has also appeared on local theater productions of *Oklahoma* and *Fiddler On The Roof*.

She plays Dorothy, the manager of a small town motel and a friend of Millie's. Dorothy appears to be a nosy character but provides the voice of reason to Millie; and possibly the only person in the film who trusts her enough to give her the responsibility she needs to move forward.

SHUMING HE | Screenwriter/Director



SHUMING HE has written and directed several short films that has traveled in the film festival circuit, as well as commissioned projects for television and new media through out Asia-Pacific. Originally from the tropical island city of Singapore, Shuming currently resides in Los Angeles, where he is a Directing Fellow at AFI Conservatory. 



Our second day at the diner proved to be an emotionally taxing scene for both the cast and crew as we moved out into the parking lot, filming a pivotal moment for the actors.
