



SYNOPSIS

Part psychological thriller, part horror film, Wonder Valley is an arthouse-style film that tells the tale of four young women caught up in the aftermath of a psychotropic drug trip gone wrong. Karian (Jade Fusco), a loner with few friends, has an unhealthy obsession with her free-spirited friend, Cloudy. Still mourning the death of her beloved aunt, she invites Cloudy out to her desert house, hoping to have time alone with her to deepen their friendship. When Cloudy shows up with two friends— the social media loving, light-hearted Jessie (Kella Birch) and the bitter, has-been TV star Sasha (Malia Scharf), Karian's disappointment is palpable. Instantly getting off on the wrong foot with the other girls, Sasha quickly becomes Karian's nemesis as their fight for Cloudy's attention turns into a fight to the death.

Troubled and in trouble with her managers, ridiculed by the press, Sasha decides Cloudy's new friend Karian is not good for her. After bickering back and forth, Sasha has a change of heart and suggests they all try DATURAS, a psychotropic drug. After some peer pressure from Cloudy and the other girls, Karian finally agrees to try it—against her better judgement.

After a drug-fueled night, Karian wakes up with a slightly altered view of reality. When they decide to go for a hike to shake off the after effects of the drugs, Karain finds she can no longer tell the difference between what is real and what is her drug-addled mind playing tricks on her. The hallucinations worsen as she gets separated from the group and discovers the dead body of a girl lying on the rocks.

Karian gradually makes her way back tot he house, where she tells the others what she saw—only they don't believe her. Karian finally convinces Cloudy to go with her to look for the body, and the two set off across the hot desert just as the sun is about to go down. Meanwhile, Sasha and Jessie argue over their friendship with Cloudy, to the point that Sasha gets physically violent with Jessie. Infuriated, and not willing to wait around for Cloudy and Karian to return, Jessie sets off after them with only a flashlight to guide her.

When Jessie finally finds Karian, Cloudy is missing and Karian is covered in blood—and claims to not remember what happened. Not convinced, and afraid for Cloudy's safety, Jessie attempts to leave in search of her, but fate has other things in store for her....

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Our film examines four beautiful, misunderstood women. At a time in life when moods constantly change and feelings of loneliness and isolation circle your mind. Wonder Valley shows the viewer just how unraveling and dark twenty-something can actually be, through the use of slow camera movements which become increasingly more chaotic with the state of the girls' minds, a soundtrack carefully composed to the mystic and sinister landscape of the desert, and atmospheric performances which will haunt us.

As the camera increasingly adopts the perspective of our protagonist Karian's mental state, this seemingly innocent girl feels the effects of the heat, drugs, and delusions—unveiling an entirely different side to her personality.

Through the intimacy of the shooting style, this film exposes the dangerous obsessiveness and desperate loneliness Karian feels trying to be accepted. The backdrop of Joshua Tree brings to life the place where meaning collapses and the personalities of these women gets lost to the desert forever.
