

Logline:

Synopsis:

When alone in the forest, Jack creates his own reality. He'd rather play pretend than to accept that his mother is gone, his father neglects him and his sister, Molly, shows him nothing but violence. But when she discovers what he has been hiding under his bed, Jack will have to decide whether to keep playing along, or to put an end to her twisted games once and for all.

Production Facts

Game was shot over four days in Fall 2016 (Sept 30-Oct 3) with a crew of 12. The second short from writer/director Joy Webster, was partially financed from grants and produced with assistance from the Ontario Arts Council and Toronto Arts Council, while the remainder of the budget was self-financed. The production was part of the Toronto Indie Production (TIP) program with ACTRA Toronto and the Canadian Media Producers Association (CMPA). Principal photography was shot on-location in Grand Bend, Ontario, Canada and inside Pinery Provincial Park, a park situated on the shores of Lake Huron. This is the second collaboration from filmmakers Joy Webster and Lucas Ford since the success of *In The Weeds*.

Filmmaker Biographies:

Joy Webster - Writer/Director/Editor



Joy Webster is an award-winning emerging filmmaker. Born and raised in Toronto, Canada, Joy is a recent alumnus of Ryerson University where she received her B.F.A. in Film Studies. Joy was the recipient of the Norman Jewison Award for best thesis film production at Ryerson University in 2015, for her film *In The Weeds*. *In The Weeds* has been screened at film festivals across North America, won numerous awards, and had its nationwide broadcast premiere on CBC's *Canadian Reflections* in October, 2016. Her latest short film, *Game*, is currently playing the international film festival circuit, was awarded 'Best Short' at the 2018 Canadian Film Festival and has screened at festivals in Canada, United States and Mexico. Joy has worked professionally as a video producer, photographer, and graphic designer. She is currently employed as the video producer for Chatelaine Magazine.

Lucas Ford - Producer



Lucas Ford is an award-winning Canadian film and television producer based in Toronto & Los Angeles. His produced work has broadcasted nationally in Canada on CBC, Bell, Air Canada and has screened and won awards at many film festivals internationally including top festivals across North America and Europe. Recent credits include: *Game* (San Diego International Film Festival, Cinéfest Sudbury), *In The Weeds* (CBC), and the 5-part series *Start Up Swap* (Bell Fibe). Lucas is a graduate of Ryerson University's School of Image Arts, a two-time Norman Jewison Filmmaker Award winner and an MFA candidate at the prestigious Peter Stark Producing Program at the University of Southern California. Lucas got his start working at the Toronto International Film Festival where he coordinated for TIFF Director & CEO Piers Handling. Following this, Lucas worked at New Metric Media where he was involved on the smash-hit series Letterkenny (2017 CSA Best Comedy) as well as Bad Blood (City/Rogers) and What Would Sal Do? (CraveTV). Currently, Lucas is developing his first feature film and is also on post-production for *The Sunset Channel*, a drama/comedy short film about a recluse who thinks he may be the sole witness of a terrible event on his television. Lucas is a voting member of the Academy of Canadian Cinema and Television.
