It's almost the end of the month and Ronny's mother has to be creative about her cooking, considering she has limited resources. She's making egg curry and khichuri for the family.


With everyone's hopes down and the family scattered, perhaps a legendary match of cricket can bring them all together.

around a simple, humble meal.



Born and raised in Dhaka, Ferdousi Ahmed always wanted to be a singer. At a young age she starred in a children's singing show and later worked as a news reporter. However, as time went on she realized that her true passion was acting. She auditioned and ended up starring in various TV shows and productions. In 1992, she received a scholarship and moved to Shantiniketon, India where she studied theatre. After finishing her masters there, she returned to Dhaka and has performed in many plays at the Shilpakala Academy in Dhaka.

Aanon H Siddiqua is a lawyer, actor, choreographer and dancer. From a very young age, she began her training in Indian classical dance, specializing in Bharat Natyam and Kathak. 
