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SHORT SYNOPSIS

On her last day, Ruby faces the inescapable remnants of alcoholism, family, and culture.

LONG SYNOPSIS

Mud (Hashtł'ishnii) follows Ruby, a mother who lives in Window Rock, AZ with her son, Joseph. In order to keep her secret of alcoholism from her family, friends, and culture, Ruby chooses to suffer with her secret rather than seek help.

On her last living day, her secret is at risk—avoiding speaking with her son about her problem, not admitting it has affected her well being, and living with jealousy. She feels stuck due to her addiction.

This all culminates when she walks home in a drunken state, not realizing the relentless freezing temperatures. While the environment serves as a reality, her death is a transcendence where she no longer suffers.


DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Mud is about Ruby's craving for connection with her son, which is hindered by her alcoholism. This story explores the overwhelming control that addiction holds over the addicted and those who love them, and the powerlessness of individuals and society to cure this illness. How does one heal the genetic destiny of a family? In a hopeless spiral, addiction promises relief from the pain that it causes, with the ultimate cure being death caused by the medicine.

On the reservation, drinking is a large problem, especially for those traveling to border towns to consume. Gallup is a border town that has one of the highest rates of deaths due to exposure. While this film is a statement of social justice, it is even more so a story of compassion for those whose voices are lost.

Alcoholism is a heavy topic, especially when it is considered a stereotype amongst Native American people. This is not a stereotype we are perpetuating. It is a harsh reality that members of the Navajo tribe are suffering as alcoholics through isolation. Isolation from family, culture, and support. This film aims to bring understanding and awareness to not only to our own people but also to those who believe that Native Americans are statistical drunks. Understanding why people hurt and are pushed to the point of addiction will help realize this issue—ignoring it will continue pain. It is only one story amongst many that are still untold.

Happiness, tragedy, joy, pain. Each day begins again.




CAST INFORMATION

Under the supervision of her 5th grade Drama instructor; Steve Neal, Trini traveled with classmates competing in local drama and performing arts festivals within the Four Corners. Upon entering high school, she pursued her passion for acting by signing up for classes and joining the Drama Club. In 2002, Trini got her break and landed a role in Showtime's Edge of

America. After filming, she committed the next few years to her education and worked in the medical field. In 2017, Trini made her return to the film industry by playing the principal role in Shaandiin Tome's film MUD (Hashtl'ishnii) as Ruby. Trini resides in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

A member of the Dine, Mandan, Hidatsa and Tsimshian tribes, Goodluck is the son of Laurie and Kevin, a Practice Manager and Internal Medicine Physician, respectively. He graduated from the prestigious Bosque School and studies drama with acclaimed acting teachers Angela Gibbs and Judith Weston in Los Angeles.

Mike Maliwanag – Director of Photography


