Logline:

Two boys wait outside a shop for a phone-call.

Short synopsis:

Starsky has never met his father. So when he receives a letter from him that he wants to talk, he skips school with his best friend Kenny to wait at the payphone outside the local shop.

Director's statement:

Waiting is a simple story with a lot of heart. It is about the reality of two young boys who have grown up with no father and how they find solidarity in that. Set outside a shop in South Auckland, it is in these isolated places where you have the most honest and intimate conversations. The film opens a discussion and an awareness of the hunger for family connections experienced by youngsters within New Zealand communities.

Director's biography:

Amberley Jo Aumua is of Samoan and Maori descent from Manurewa, New Zealand. She is a writer/director who holds a Bachelor of Performing and Screen Arts. Her first short film Waiting (17) won the Jury Prize for Best Film at the New Zealand International Film Festival (17), Best Student Film at the Show Me Shorts International Film Festival (17) and was in competition at the Toronto International Film Festival (17). It has currently screened in over 20 film festivals, most recently at the BFI London Film Festival (18). Her recent short film Moa Ma Le Pinko (Chicken & Bingo, 18) made with two other indigenous key creatives, was created as part of the Native Slam film challenge for Maoriland Film Festival where it won the Audience Award and was selected to screen at ImagineNATIVE Film + Media Arts Festival (18). She is currently in production as one of nine writer and directors for the vignette feature film Vai. It will connect eight stories about the journey of empowerment through culture, over the lifetime of one woman, Vai.
