# FILMMAKER BIO

Jim is an award-winning, Filipino-American filmmaker based in Chicago, IL. He was named one of Newcity's FILM 50 of 2016 and 2018, alongside such production notables as Dick Wolf (*Law & Order*), The Wachowskis (The *Matrix* Trilogy), and Joe Swanberg. His feminist psychological horror short, VIOLETS, won the Audience Award at the 22nd Chicago Underground Film Festival.

Jim's latest film, LIBRARY HOURS, can currently be seen on the festival circuit. Lisa Vandever of CineKink describes it as, "beautifully shot and impeccably realized...a lush tale of literary longing, a sumptuous meeting of both mind and flesh."

# DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

LIBRARY HOURS is a queer, femme-driven love story about books and bondage. Provocative, yet Fifty Shades smarter than...that other movie.

We wanted to deliver an intriguing tale with a unique approach—a satisfying viewing experience that's also an alternative to the bulk of mainstream content (non-diverse, male-driven, largely heterosexual narratives). The film introduces renowned genderfluid, pansexual fetish model Cam Damage, and SFX make-up artist Melissa Vento in their debut roles. With a cameo by beloved internet cat, Captain Pancakes!

I made LIBRARY HOURS with a gender- and ethnically diverse crew, with socially conscious and sex-positive intent: as incentive to reaching the film's crowdfunding goal, I donated the equivalent of 10% (out-of-pocket) to the Planned Parenthood Action Fund, which was doubled during a PPACT promotion to total \$1,000 in donations on behalf of the film.

#### Cam Damage ("Camille")

Stormbringer. Unbroken feral child. Lover of rope + pain. Cam is a renowned alternative/fetish model based in Baltimore. She's appeared in *Vogue Italia*, *Purple Diary* and ads for American Apparel, while her very NSFW <u>Tumblr page</u> currently boasts over 140,000 followers. She can next be seen in Anthony DiBlasi's upcoming feature *Extremity*.

#### Melissa Vento ("Delphine")

Melissa is a <u>SFX/beauty makeup artist</u> working in the worlds of high fashion, film (such as The Safdie's *Good Time*), television and commercials. She's repped by Adamis Group. LIBRARY HOURS marks her debut onscreen performance.





#### Captain Pancakes (Introducing)

### Laura Day (Producer)

Laura currently serves as Creative Producer for the femme filmmaking and event production collective, Women of The Now. Her commercial clients have included General Motors and Neogen. Having studied both Political Science and Film at Northwestern, Laura often finds herself drawn to work with social justice or conservation narratives. She's passionate about films that feature strong marginalized characters, as she believes in their ability to uproot prejudice.

### Tony Moorman (Cinematographer)

Tony is a Cincinnati-based filmmaker, specializing in narrative films, music videos, and documentaries. In 2015 he produced, directed and released his documentary feature, *Making IT*, which follows the daily trials of a group of working artists, while his latest similarly themed documentary, <u>C.F. Payne: An American Illustrator</u> is now available through Vimeo On Demand. In 2001 he attended New York Film Academy with writer-director, Jim Vendiola, and co-lensed Jim's 2015 award-winner, *Violets*.

### Joshua Lopatin (Sound Editor, Voice-Over Engineer)

Joshua is a freelance <u>recording engineer, post-production engineer, and music producer</u>. He graduated at the top of his class at Columbia College Chicago, and spent years working on critically acclaimed rock and jazz music before transitioning to audio for film. His credits include Jim's previous *Violets* and *Drift*, and King is a Fink's *I Hate Tommy Finch*.

### The Joinery (Executive Producer)

Named one of *Crain's Chicago Business*' "Best New Event Spaces", <u>The Joinery</u> is a venue in the Logan Square neighborhood that specializes in weddings and other social gatherings, also functioning as a day-light studio, gallery, and production space. A large portion of LIBRARY HOURS was filmed on location.



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
