SYNOPSIS

Lyric Hayes is an afrocentric podcast host in search to find his greatest idol and bestselling author, Harambe Cornell. We meet Lyric in the middle of seducing a hippie yoga instructor on his podcast when he learns she has information that will help him find Harambe Cornell. Unfortunately, he is forced to take care of his nine-year-old son Jacob, dressed in a blueberry costume.

Jacob wants to go to his favorite restaurant, Mr. Rainbow's to compete in a singing competition, but Lyric drags Jacob along on his quest to find Harambe. On the way there he tries to talk his son out of being a blueberry and the value of Harambe's teachings, just when he is confronted by a jilted ex-lover who seeks a petty revenge.

Once they get to Harambe's house they meet a woman named Grace. Grace later reveals to him that she is Harambe Cornell and asks Jacob to sing the Mr. Rainbows song. Lyric hears the song about being authentic and true to yourself. It is in that moment when Lyric realizes that his biggest teacher isn't Harambe but his son Jacob.

PURPOSE

Blueberry is a simple story about complex characters, a theme Martina carries throughout all of her work. She usually writes female characters who investigate tough interpersonal relationships most people are too scared to confront. Having a male lead felt like a challenge she wanted to explore. This particular story is important to her because the character of Lyric was one she drew similarities from her own father. It's the complexity of her own internal conflict that inspires her to delve deeper to discover how people relate to one another. By exploring the contradictions and complexities of these characters we are able to really have a deeper understanding of the human condition that hopefully inspires us to be better versions of ourselves. Whether it is television or films Martina wants to be in control of content that represents honest moments in life that are painful, funny, ironic and everything in between.


