

At the age of 38, Lorian was diagnosed with breast cancer and underwent a lifesaving double mastectomy.

Three years later, Lorian still struggles with the aftermath of her surgery. She is a single mother and faces the looming fact that, due to a possible genetic mutation, her two teenage daughters, like her, may be diagnosed with breast cancer young. Therefore, she wants to encourage her daughters to start genetic testing at twenty-five and then, by thirty, receive a preventive double mastectomy. In that decision, Lorian carries a magnitude of guilt. This documentary explores the complexities of that conversation.

Meanwhile, an artist, Lorian's friend (and coincidentally, the director's father), was compelled to play hommage to Lorian's journey through a painting. Lorian has many intimate feelings and insecurities surrounding her double mastectomy surgery...and now she must open up to her daughters in order to protect them. It's her drive, as a parent and breast cancer survivor, to prepare her daughters for a highly probable future – one that she lived and continues to live.

# **Short Synopsis:**

A breast cancer survivor encourages her two teenage daughters to have a double mastectomy by the time they're thirty. Meanwhile, an artist creates a painting to help communicate her message.

### **Director's Statement**

I first met Lorian in 2016 through my father (the artist and friend featured in the documentary). Lorian confided in us that she wanted her daughters to have a preventative double mastectomy and that she didn't know how to approach that conversation. She still struggled with intimate feelings and insecurities about her surgery - how losing her breasts affected her sense of femininity, sexuality, and overall identity. Lorian was and is not alone in this thinking. Having gone through a double mastectomy and reconstruction surgery (twice), she feels responsible to help other women in her situation by sharing her story. Especially, young women. My goal for this documentary has been, and will continue to be, to help Lorian facilitate that conversation.


