

Salvador, a gay Mexican elder who has lost his partner of 15 years, calls his partner's estranged son, Anthony, to tell him of his father's passing. Unaware of their relationship, Anthony travels from Chicago to a small rural town in Mexico to attend his father's funeral. Salvador invites Anthony to his home to pick up mementos his father wanted him to have. As family secrets are exposed, identities and perceptions are challenged.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

With "Acuitzeramo," I set out to explore a segment of our community that is rarely taken into account; gay Latinx elders.

I grew up bi-nationally, in Acuitzeramo, a small rural town in Michoacan, Mexico and in Pauma Valley, a small town in San Diego County in the U.S. I lived half a year in each country until the age of 13. As I grew older, I began to wonder how many men and women were gay in these small towns. And wondered how many were forced to go through the motions of heterosexual life. At a younger age, I do clearly remember some men and women that were single all their lives. I always thought they never married because they didn't find a mate; but then as I grew older, I realized that perhaps they did not feel comfortable being with the mate they truly wanted.

I began to explore a story of two elderly men living together in isolation because of fear of not being accepted by their families and children. Then I thought about what it would be like if one of the men passed away after a decades-long relationship. This film tells the story of Salvador, a gay elder in a small Mexican town who loses his partner of over 15 years. The story begins with the partner's estranged son, Anthony, showing up at Salvador's doorstep for his father's funeral. The situation immediately created an interesting dynamic where two strangers, an elderly gay man from Mexico and a young man from Chicago, were forced to interact. Both men are tested to see if through love, empathy, and tolerance they can bridge a generational, cultural, and class gap.

So often in many areas of society, it seems like our elders, especially our queer elders, are pushed aside and forgotten. I wanted to tell this story in hopes of reviving respect for this segment of our community and remind us that it is precisely at this time in their lives that they are need of compassion and love.

A Vision / History

Miguel Angel Caballero (Director/ Writer/ Producer) and Luis Aldana (Actor/ Executive Producer) met at UCLA and they have a twenty-year shared trajectory in theater and film. Together they founded Cabaldana Alchemy, a company committed to tell Latinx, Chicano and Queer stories.

Filmed In Director's Hometown In Mexico

The film was shot in Miguel Angel Caballero's hometown of Acuitzeramo in the state of Michoacan, Mexico. His father, other relatives and friends are part of the film in featured roles.

Father Had First Theater In Town

In the 1970s and 1980s, the director's father had the first movie theater in the surrounding small towns in Mexico. Now, 2019, his son, Miguel Angel Caballero, filmed his father right in front of the dilapidated remains of the movie theater in a small role for the film Acuitzeramo, bringing his father's love for cinema full circle.

Life Imitates Art, Imitates Life

The picture of the father and son that actor Luis Aldana who plays "Anthony" leaves for the character of "Salvador" is actually a picture of Luis and his own father who in real life disappeared when he was a child.

"The Serpent Will Be King" - Meaning of Acuitzeramo

Acuitzeramo is a small town where the director grew up. Legend has it that it means "The serpent will be king." The director liked the name since a serpent, in a spiritual context, means transformation, shedding the past and new beginnings, which is precisely what the main character, Salvador, is doing in the town.

Luis has starred in a number of films, including *Crabgrass Manifesto*, which screened at the *Sundance Film Festival*, *The Silent Cross*, which was an audience favorite at the *San Francisco Film Festival* – *Cine Accion* and *Pelea de Gallos*, which won Best short at the *Los Angeles Latino International Film Festival* and *San Diego Latino Film Festival* and had a national debut on the *Showtime Network*. Miguel Angel is an an award winning writer/director/ producer. He has won four awards and has been


