SYNOPSIS

Set during the early 50s, a 6-year-old boy discovers the feeling of guilt for the first time after stealing a bean from a local market.

ABOUT

The Little Thief is a 35mm visual essay created by a group of filmmakers as part of their Master of Fine Arts degree from the American Film Institute Conservatory. The piece is a character-driven drama that explores themes such as loss of innocence, guilt and moral codes.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

The feeling of guilt is a moral emotion and an adaptive response to transgressions. But when should we feel guilt and when shouldn't we?

As a kid, I remember stealing small things that were useless to me. The action was more related to the thrill of the moment with friends, the adrenaline we felt by doing so and maybe, at a subconscious level, looking for some sort of social approval or belonging. It also came from an innocent place, probably not even thinking if it would affect anyone.

As we grow up we start questioning our own principles as individuals. Society has established rules that we must follow in order to regulate our behavior and within time, we decide which one of these are a part of our set of values or moral compass as humans inhabiting the world. In this short piece, a young boy steals a single bean from a stand and experiences the emotion of guilt afterwards, even though no one is actually aware of his action.

This little story intents to portray guilt as becoming aware of our own actions. There is a difference in feeling guilt because someone is telling us we should or because we are actually discovering and building our own consciousness. When the latter occurs and we are able to recognize our actions by our own means, we are growing up.
