LOGLINE:

A spiritual woman recites her affirmations for decolonization, while protests erupt over another state sanctioned killing.

SHORT SYNOPSIS:

In the absurdist world of Providence Plantations, a spiritual woman works to decolonize her thoughts. While driving home from her job at the sleep lab, she tries to block out news of another state sanctioned killing. After narrowly missing a run in with police, the line between reality and a waking nightmare begins to blur.

LONG SYNOPSIS:

DRIVING WHILE BLACK MAGIC is the opening to an absurd alternate near future where Nadege, a spiritual woman, works to decolonize herself through daily rituals for affirmation. She works a soul crushing job at a sleep lab, for a boss who can never get her name right. Nadege has to work late again, while her husband Reggie and their dog Fatboy wait for her in their new condo in Providence Plantations.

Before she starts her commute, Nadege casts a spell of protection for her drive home. During the drive, she blocks out news of more protests over another state sanctioned killing. She turns on her self help tape, reciting the teachings of Obeah the Spirit Mother.

After narrowly missing a run in with police, Nadege begins to have premonitions of danger. As she gets closer to home, the line between reality and a waking nightmare begins to blur.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT:

I directed DRIVING WHILE BLACK MAGIC to explore the internal world of someone trying to decolonize herself in an oppressive state. It is a surrealist film based on the play A FURTIVE MOVEMENT: THE USE OF FARCE written by my collaborator Vatic Tayari Kuumba. I met Vatic by chance at a community art show in 2018. We found common ground as artists who are interested in creating weird and immersive work through a strong anti-racist lens. When I first read his play, I was immediately drawn into the world of Providence Plantations and how it mirrors our own. Many people outside of our homestate do not know our official name is "The State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations." This legacy of slavery was on the state seal until June 2020, when the Governor finally issued an executive order to drop it.

Our goal with this film was more than telling a story; we wanted to create a visceral experience that drops the viewer in the POV of our heroine Nadege. The audience should experience her daily rituals for protection and affirmation and feel her weariness and anxiety from living in an anti-Black world.

In the play, A FURTIVE MOVEMENT, Providence Plantations is a Purgatory where all the characters are trapped in a theatrical farce. Adapting this idea of Purgatory or a liminal space to the screen was one of my biggest challenges as a director. I incorporated symbolism and repeating imagery to conjure an other-worldly atmosphere in the art direction to hint at this concept. It was also important that we show the destructiveness of police violence without being overly graphic. In this world, blood becomes crystals and rose petals.

I am inspired by Nadege and Obeah, complex women who find power through ritual. How do you decolonize your own thoughts when faced with the lurking presence of structural racism and state violence? This film attempts to answer that question through the experience of one woman's daily commute home.

FILMMAKERS:

Julia C Liu, Director and Editor

Julia is a Providence based director, cinematographer and artist. Her passion for visual storytelling started through her comics, evolving into filmmaking as a way to bring her illustrations to life. Liu is a contributing director to the New York Times' Emmy-nominated Op-Doc Series and has directed and shot music videos premiering on Stereogum, NPR Music, and The 405. She is a member of the International Cinematographers Guild Local 600 and a graduate of Brown University.

Vatic Tayari Kuumba, Writer and Story Creator

Vatic is a writer, activist, poet, rapper and creator. He is developing a cycle of plays with Rites & Reason Theatre at Brown University and Trinity Repertory Company. Raised inside a redline box, Kuumba is a child of two veterans of Jim Crow Florida. In 2014, he was arrested during a Black Lives Matter protest - almost losing his job as the Director of the 21st Century School in Providence because of his activism. DRIVING WHILE BLACK MAGIC is based on the universe and characters in his play A FURTIVE MOVEMENT: THE USE OF FARCE.

Keith is a filmmaker, web developer, and interactive media designer who has created a wide range of media experiences from documentaries to multimedia art exhibits and music videos. A two-time New England Urban Music Award winner, Becky's angelic voice and skillful steel pan playing can be heard while performing her Caribbean Soul music.

Kelly Seigh, Supporting Actress

Kelly Seigh is a Providence based actor. She received her MFA in Acting at the Trinity Rep Conservatory in 2002. Kelly was a co-founding member of Elemental Theatre Collective and has worked with Trinity Repertory Company, The Gamm, The Wilbury Group, Living Literature and the Manton Avenue Project locally as well as with North Shore Music Theatre in Boston and the Wagon Wheel Theatre in Indiana.
