LOGLINE

Intrigued by the tale of a strange man living in isolation with a chimpanzee, filmmaker David Romberg travels to his childhood home in Brazil to find him, only to discover that the tale pales in comparison to what he uncovers.



Set on a remote jungle island, "The Man of the Monkey", unravels a labyrinth of interconnected uncanny characters, all seeking refuge. Amongst them, an exiled Argentine Jewish artist haunted by phantoms of the past, a former prisoner with nowhere to go, and a suspected Nazi living in isolation with a monkey.

Moving between personal and collective histories about political turmoil and displacement, the film illuminates the intricacies and contradictions by which trauma defines our identities in the never-ending search for a home.

SYNOPSIS

Directors Statement

While this documentary unfolded over the course of ten years, the origin of the story goes back much further. In the mid 1970's, my father, seeking refuge following an escape from the Military Dictatorship in Argentina, built a small house on an island off the coast of Brazil. Ilha Grande and its few inhabitants, which included my family, existed largely secluded from the rest of the world.

The early portion of my childhood was spent living "off grid" on this remote island. We lived with no electricity or running water and our food was largely supplied by gardens and daily fishing. On quiet, star filled nights, my father shared fantastical stories and myths surrounding this mysterious island's history. He shared tales of pirates seeking hidden treasure, and of spirits that roamed the forests at night. But there was one story, the Man of the Monkey, that fascinated me so much, it lingered well into my adulthood. My father would speak of a German man with a spooky disposition living deep within the rainforest. The daunting man took a female monkey as his wife and together, they scared away all passersby. My father warned, "You must never venture too far in the forest or he will capture you". (continues)



For reasons I could not quite understand at the time, that story remained ever so prominent in my mind. While my family ultimately left the island, my intrigue of the dangerous tales persisted. After all, there was no shortage of dangerous tales in my family's history, including my Grandfather's escape from the Cosacks in Russia, a harrowing escape from Nazi Germany by my grandmother, and my father's exile from Argentina during the "Dirty War". These stories were often shared with the younger generations as both a cautionary measure and a grim reminder of our history.

As I grew older, I learned new details surrounding the complex history of my family. I became aware of the Nazis that escaped capture in Europe, only to live freely in South America. I heard stories of escaped Nazi's living next door to their Jewish victims, who also fled to South America. I thought back to my father's tale of the mysterious German man living on the island. Was there truth to this tale? Could it be possible we were cohabitating our little island paradise with a Nazi? Ultimately, this question became the catalyst to return to my childhood home on the island. I was determined to unravel the mystery behind the Man of the Monkey.

What I ultimately discovered in my journey, would irreversibly change my understanding of my family's history. What started as a journey to find the meaning behind a childhood tale, became an unfolding of a transgenerational trauma that I had also inherited. In retracing the tracks that brought my father and the Man of the Monkey to the same remote island in search of sanctuary, I found myself creating a new story. A new, rather complicated story of the meaning of refuge and the never ending search for home.
