Synopsis

Pacarrete is an old and crazy ballet dancer. Over the years, she works as the teacher for classic dance and ballet in Fortaleza with ambition. After retirement, she goes back to hometown. However, still undaunted, she decides to give a dance performance, as a gift "to the people", on the eve of the city's 200-year anniversary party. But it seems nobody cares.

This thrilling drama stars Marcelia Cartaxo, Best Actress at the Berlin Film Festival for the classic "The Hour of the Star" by Suzana Amaral. With João Miguel, Zezita Matos and Soia Lira in the cast.

Synopsis2

An eccentric old woman dances to the beat of her own drum in Allan Deberton's poignant debut feature. Pacarrete (the sublime Marcelia Cartaxo), a former ballet dancer who lives in northeast Brazil, decides to dust off her tutu slip and her ballet slippers to perform a classic dance for her city's 200th-anniversary celebration--whether the townspeople want it or not. A broad comedy turns increasingly contemplative as the true nature of Pacarrete's daily life becomes apparent.

About Allan Deberton

Producer, director and screenwriter, Allan Deberton is graduated in Cinema at Universidade Federal Fluminense (UFF-RJ). He has directed awarded films such as "Coconut Sweet" (2010), "The Best Friend" (2013), "Arthur's Eyes" (2016), that together participated in over 100 national and international Film Festivals and won 49 awards. In 2014, he took classes with Hollywood's screenwriter Robert Mackee at the Globosat Screenwriter's Program. In 2015, he produced the feature documentary "The Other Side of The Atlantic", by Márcio Câmara and Daniele Ellery, premiered at Havana Film Festival. In 2017, he co-produced the television series "Lana & Carol" by Samuel Brasileiro and Natalia Maia. In 2018, he coproduced with Globo Filmes the telefilm "Baião de Dois". On the theate branch, he has produced shows like "Avenue Q - The Broadway Musical" (2015 and 2016), "The Hour of The Star – The Musical" (2017) and "Confessed Love" (2014 and 2016), the training program "Broadway Brazil" (2013, 2016, 2017 and 2018) with the Broadway Dreams Foundation. In 2019, he produced the short film "Those Two", by Émerson Maranhão, winner of 19 awards in 40 film festivals. In the same year he premiered his first full-length film "Pacarrete" at the 22nd Shanghai International Film Festival, nominated for the Golden Goblet Awards and the big winner at the 47th Gramado Film Festival (8 awards), including Best Picture, Best Picture by Popular Jury, Best Original Screenplay and Best Director. He won the 'Rajatha Chakoram' (The Silver Crow Pheasant) award for Best Director at the 24th International Film Festival of Kerala (India). He is currently developing the projects "The Best Friend", "The adoption" and "Ladies on the floor".



Short version:

After directing successful short films, Allan Deberton co-produced the "Lana & Carol" TV series and the feature film entitled "The Other Side of the Atlantic", which premiered at the 37th Havana Film Festival. "Pacarrete", the first feature he directed, had its world premiere at the 22nd Shanghai International Film Festival and ran in important film festivals, winning 30 awards.

About Marcelia Cartaxo

Marcélia Cartaxo is considered one of the greatest Brazilian actresses. She received the Silver Bear for Best Actress at the Berlin Film Festival, with the feature film "The Hour of the Star" (1985, by Suzana Amaral). She acted in several other films, with emphasis on "Madame Satan" and "Love for Sale", both by Karim Aïnouz, "Bog of Beasts" (2006, by Claudio Assis), "The History of Eternity" (2014, by Camilo Cavalcante) and in several soap operas and television programs. In addition, she has also made short films as a director, screenwriter and actress. In 2015, she won the Best Actress award at the Brasília Film Festival for the film "Big Jet" (2015, by Cláudio Assis). In 2019, she won the Kikito Award for Best Actress, at the 47th Gramado Film Festival, for the consecration of her role in Allan Deberton's "Pacarrete". This work also earned her awards at LABRFF (Los Angeles Brazilian Film Festival), where she was also honored, at the Vitória Film Festival, among others. Recently, she acted in the feature films "Acqua Movie", by Lírio Ferreira; "Helen", by André Meirelles Collazzo and "The Mother", by Cristiano Burlan (unreleased); and also in the short films "Hyena Ethics", by Rodolpho de Barros; "Gaza Strip", by Lúcio César Fernandes Murilo; and "She who lives on the top floor", by Amarildo Martins.
