

# **SYNOPSIS**

Alberto Buenaventura is that increasingly common breed — a digital nomad living on the road, unattached. But not much else is common about him. He's not only a successful photojournalist; he befriends strangers and gets involved in unusual whimsical adventures, often fancying himself a hero. Then just as quickly, he's off to the next place, following the spontaneous current of life.

Leaving NYC, however, proves to be a different type of beast. Al's attempts to find a way out lead him all over the 5 boroughs, forcing him to deal with various groups of colorful characters that complicate the process and in some cases, make him re-examine his lifestyle... Will he escape the lure of the city?



# **DIRECTOR'S Q&A**

Chris, the mixed aesthetic of *Alberto* is very distinct. Why did you choose to make an adventure film (referenced in the maps and aerials, the music, the way Alberto aspires to live) in such a raw style?

Practically, that's what we could pull off! But yeah, it was always part of the concept.

#### How would you describe that concept? Injecting reality into the genre?

I think more specifically, I wanted to make you feel that adventure is possible in the world around you. I wanted to give you that dose of inspiration. I grew up on Indiana Jones, and I do feel like living in New York is a beautiful adventure. It's not the stock exotic type we usually see on film, but it doesn't have to be.

On the other hand, I wanted to show how the real world gets in the way. Life is often ridiculous, and unfairly against us, and everyone has their own agenda, and the harder we try to negotiate with them, the more we get pulled into frustrating tangents. It's *Curb Your Enthusiasm*. It's *After Hours*.

So that was my guiding principle. To put the real NYC -- and all the clutter and absurdity I witness -- in the way of this freedom-seeker. And to ask what an adventure would actually look like in our street-level world. And also, to ask what dilemma real-life adventurous types may end up facing. That was the heart. Independence vs belonging.

#### Did this rough-and-tumble approach allow for some randomness in the plot and filming?

Well, it was important to give the impression of reality unfolding without any planning. But actually, most of it was planned and scripted. And edited on paper before we were even shooting.

It's only random if you're taking it at the level of plot. This film was two different stories. One, a story about frustration, which yeah, is about the plot being interrupted by random fun tangents.

But two, a story about a character being forced to reconsider his attitudes. Even though the plot appears to be going in circles, there's something else developing. To that end, I don't think you need to keep track of all the plot details. The plot itself is the MacGuffin. Just one big obstacle. In the second half, it becomes more of the backdrop, as we gradually focus more on Alberto's inner story... His feelings. His lifestyle being questioned. So not truly random.

In a way, the film places us next to Alberto. Were you worried that audiences would get as frustrated as him, if they expected him to make typical, steady progressions?

Yeah, but that's my humor. Hell is other people. If we find the encounters and characters annoying, like Alberto must, then great, because they are the conflict. But again, I feel like that stuff gradually slides over, to make way for Alberto's personal dilemma.

There's also the sense that you want us to perceive these characters, annoying or not, as part of the tapestry of life worth enjoying.

I hope so yeah. That's the other thing. I really wanted to show NYC in a fresh way. To show off the geography of the city and give context to scenes (using maps, Google Earth transitions, and choreographed shots) and make that navigational style one of the things worth seeing. It's something I would love to develop more in depth in other cities. But I wanted to try NYC first. This is my love letter to a place I've been close to my whole life. To the corners we don't always get shown. And to the diverse people you pass by every day and sometimes have the privilege of meeting, if only briefly.

#### Are you personally like Alberto?

I think I'm adventurous. Creativity is my adventure. And real adventurers to me are people that don't really fit. As a kid, my eyes were always on the horizon. Maybe this had to do with being a minority, but I felt divorced from that too—the implied Asian American experience, whatever it was. It's just not how I grew up. I sometimes feel guilty for not having more to say about it. But then I also feel like, I shouldn't have to. At a time when identity politics is everywhere, I'd rather focus on culture being a mixed cacophony (hence the name cards in the film, listing the eclectic mix of groups a character belongs to).

I've always needed the freedom to find my own way, but on the flip side, I'm someone who gets very attached. Just before writing *Alberto*, my parents had to sell my childhood home. I suddenly felt very rootless. I returned to my apartment in New York, wondering about all the others in this city renting their lives.

So *Alberto* became this tug-of-war between freedom and belonging, and I think it's in all of us to an extent, especially now in a world where commitment is loose and things are easily discarded.

#### What do you want to tell people about the production?

That it was definitely ambitious, ha. We filmed across the 5 boroughs, with a cast of over 100. That sprawling quality was very important to capture and show audiences. It was a 2 million dollar movie, done for a tiny fraction of that. Producer Paull Cho believed in the very indie approach required to fit everything in. While he managed the logistics of the business and crew, I was mapping out every creative element and doubling as casting director. We did something mammoth, and we did it DIY.

The most important thing I accounted for was a period of "secondary photography" beyond the two weeks of principal. That ended up being two more months, without our ten-person crew, just me and a few of the actors, sometimes cinematographer Arthur Woo, sometimes makeup artist Jiamin (who had to do a special look). We'd sporadically plan shoots a day in advance, then hopscotch around the city. I'd run audio out of my backpack. We had such a small camera, so most pedestrians didn't pay much attention, and I really wanted to capture that, that sense of life taking place around us.

### What are your hopes for the film?

That it gives you a sense of the absurdity of life. And gives you some poignant feelings. And shows you a new way of navigating a city.

The film has already inspired me to create expanded content. Simple, docu-style, just me, the camera, wireless mics, sometimes a second camera op. I've started placing them on a map (albertomap.com), many of which are "Street Scenes," a series where I'm listening in on real conversations around the city (with the subjects' permission). I still have more to add, and I'd love to eventually expand it into other cities and countries. It's all part of the Alberto spirit.


