




SHORT SYNOPSIS

Poppy Valentine, a young circus performer who has grown up in her family's traveling circus, has never dreamed of what life would be like outside of its fences. However, now in her mid-20's and with more unwelcomed responsibility weighing her down, she's desperate to figure out if this life is for her. As she slowly begins to take time for herself, finding independence and even love, she strains her relationship with those around her in the tight-knit circus community. In the end, amidst her overprotective father, stressful circus expectations, and her blossoming curiosity for a life of her own, she must find a way to be happy.

LONG SYNOPSIS

Poppy Valentine is a 24-year old balloon animal artist, whose oneof-a-kind creations are one of the traveling circus' main attractions, aside from her father's nightly magic show. Dark Valentine, her father, who's spent the majority of his life running the circus that was handed down to him, has now become disillusioned with its shortcomings. Stopping the show for the offseason, the Valentines and their circus community must now pack up and head to their newest location, which is currently undecided. This time of limbo causes Dark to add unnecessary pressure and responsibility onto Poppy's shoulders. Unsure of how to meet her father's expectations, Poppy starts to wonder what life would be like without them.


The opportunity to explore her feelings further arises when she runs a late-night errand, picking up gas at a local station nearby. There, she runs into Drew, a cute and friendly local who is a few years older than her and talks too much. Taking him up on his offer, she accepts a ride from him back to her circus location. They quickly build a mutual connection and Drew gives her his number before departing.


Distracted from her interaction with Drew, Poppy accidentally leaves the front gate of the circus unlocked and open, allowing for a late-night vandalization to destroy some of their tents and equipment. Putting two and two together, Dark discovers it was Poppy's fault the gate was not locked. With that information, he forces her to clean the mess up by herself in the blazing heat. From this, she becomes fed up, choosing to have a night out away from the circus with her closest friends, Sadie and Lala. Towards the end of their fun, eventful night, they run into Drew once more. The energy between Poppy and Drew continues to blossom into something more intimate, and by the time they arrive back at the circus, Poppy has a taste of what happiness and independence might feel like. She continues to go out, but alone now, and she eventually gets caught by Dark. Their argument pushes Poppy further away and makes Dark more desperate to keep Poppy close. However, the weight of her actions causes the community to ostracize her. Feeling the isolation, she seeks a chance to find that happiness again and attends a party Drew invited her, Lala, and Sadie to. At the small party, consisting of just them, Drew, and two of Drew's friends, Poppy finds what she is looking for and the connection between her and Drew builds into something more physical. When they return to the group, however, miscommunications and a reveal of Poppy's decision to leave the circus cause the foundation of her friendships to become unstable. Sadie puts up a fight, with Lala behind her, backing Poppy into a corner. With things starting to fall apart, Poppy shifts and knows what she needs to do.

Poppy returns to the circus, having decided it's time to start a new life for herself. She and Dark confront each other and their roles in the dissolution of their family. Feeling hurt and betrayed by Poppy's confrontation, Dark doesn't give her more time to work things out and leaves her in tears. He leaves her with the guilt of how she's chosen to abandon everyone and everything. Poppy, totally alone now, makes her way back into town, stopping at a cheap motel to sleep. For the first time in her life, she's anxious and has no idea what's to come next, however, the motel owner sees Poppy's distress and offers a helping hand. And while it doesn't solve all of Poppy's problems, she feels a sense of hope.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT



Balloon Animal is a story grounded in fantasy and realism set against the backdrop of a lackluster circus and a vibrant small town. While the circus evokes feelings of whimsy and excitement, this film challenges those notions in a visual and thought-provoking way. By presenting the perspective of a woman who has fallen out of love with the circus because she's seen behind its curtains, we give our audience context and reason as to why the fantasy no longer exists there. Balloon Animal plays with themes of identity, independence, familial expectations, and sacrifice. Throughout Poppy's journey of rebellion, love, and self-discovery, we are introduced to the burdens that lead her to sacrifice close relationships to take back the power to create her own future and find her own freedoms.

As a writer and director, my films all draw from personal experience, which is in no way unusual. For the last five years, I've been driven by my love of the human condition, touching on how tragic, yet beautiful, it can be. In particular, I focus on love and heartbreak, gender inequality, and family dynamics. Each character is flawed. They are their own protagonist and antagonist in any story. My goal is to study those types of characters, analyzing everything about them to build an infinite amount of depth, showcasing them on the screen in an authentic, yet cinematic way. With all this said, I will continually hold this film close to my heart. It's my second feature and a story that can be universally understood, highlighting my strengths as a director, but also adding a new perspective into the world of a young woman coming-of-age.

FILMMAKER BIOGRAPHIES



Em Johnson is the writer and director for Balloon Animal, which is her second feature narrative in those roles. During the two and a half years of development, filming, and post, she worked closely with every department to accurately bring her vision to life. Throughout her career so far, she's had the opportunity to work internationally, on widely diverse sets, experiencing the world on an intimate level and learning more and more about the human condition. Her work tends to focus on the flaws and strengths of each individual and how tragic, yet beautiful, they can be. She holds Balloon Animal very dear to her heart and is proud of how much she has grown, both as a writer and director.

Katherine Waddell is a 29-year-old actress and producer who grew up in São Paulo, Brazil, and has studied fine arts for over 18 years, spanning two continents. Her first producing credit came from her role as Associate Producer on Six L.A. Love Stories, featuring Matthew Lillard, Alicia Witt, and Carrie Preston. Her latest credits comes as Co-Executive Producer on Dinner in America starring Kyle Gallner and Emily Skeggs, from PSH Creative and Ben Stiller's Red Hour Productions. Dinner in America was officially selected to compete in the US Dramatic Competition at Sundance 2020. She is also an executive producer on We Need To Do Something, a horror film that premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival. Now residing in Los Angeles, in 2020 Katherine started the production company First Bloom Films alongside writer and director, Em Johnson, and they recently completed their companies first feature, Balloon Animal.




