

# **SYNOPSIS** Over the course of a cold winter graveyard shift at a New York City morgue, a lonely embalmer discovers a renewed sense of life when he comes face to face with his recently deceased doppelgänger on his mortuary table. Perplexed by the absurdity of the circumstances, the embalmer seeks answers by investigating the decedent's origins which leads him to a grieving widow whom he becomes obsessed with. While some stones are best left unturned, the embalmer encounters an opportunity to face his own demons on his ethereal night journey.



# DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I'm a director of cross-cultural identity; my work naturally reflects a collision of eastern and western worldviews. I'm fascinated by this clash and the possible poetry that may emerge from the cross-pollination. My film participates in this kind of mystic mixture, manifesting into a macabre & voyeuristic character study, following the unreliable narrator attempting to reconcile the paradox of reality and its tension between one's internal subjective experiences against the outside objective world. Ideally, "Man in the Morgue" becomes a brief cinematic meditation on life & death, love, and existence.


