Synopsis

The afterlife. What is it? Where is it? Who's there?

Wol, a one-eyed creature, mysteriously wakes up in the woods. He is unaware of who or what he is. As he gets up, he looks at his cut-ridden arms with confusion. He lowers them and journeys within the woods. He notices various objects embedded within the grass. Basketballs, broken records, and a razor blade that shines brightly from the bark of a tree. In the reflection of the razor blade is Etten, a 17-year old human who stares back at Wol, matching each and every one of his movements. As Wol takes his hand and extends it up towards the blade, the light from the blade overtakes the entire environment.

The light fizzles out as Etten sits on his bed listening to a song on his record player. He drives to school, gets through his mundane day, and returns home. At the dinner table sits Etten, his mom, and his dad. Etten sits still at the table while his mom and dad eat their food. No one seems to see this immense pain Etten finds himself in. Etten goes to his bedroom, lays on his bed, and then heads into his bathroom. He looks at his cut-ridden body looking back at him. He tears up and lifts up a razor blade. He takes a deep breath.

In The Void lies Wol, who gets up and looks around at the darkness surrounding him. In the distance, a door opens. Wol turns towards the light and walks in the direction of the light. As he approaches the door, Etten walks out from beyond. Etten's cut-ridden body is accompanied by two bloody arms. Wol walks closer as Etten does the same. Both Etten and Wol look at each other with understanding and pain. Etten quickly falls onto Wol as the light from the door overtakes both of them, and thrusts them back into the woods.

As Wol and Etten lay in the woods, together, Wol cries. He looks out into the distance and sees a flowing river. He looks back at Etten's lifeless body and turns him over.
