

ABOUT THE FILM

Vanessa and Luna Hernandez find themselves in uncharted territory when they are forced into exile to Mexico, a land they have not only never been to, but don't speak the language. But, our girls are Gen-Zers and they make the best of every situation, certain that their tech-savvy will help them find a way out of this mess. While they enjoy every moment of eating taquitos, they want to go home to Los Angeles, by any means necessary. They make a list of possible plans to get home, which includes swindling bad hombres out of money in order to pay a coyote to smuggle them across the border. When they inadvertently connect with a few lovelorn terrorists, all bets are off as they become the FBI's only hope for taking the terrorists down and saving the world. These two undocumented women are the only hope for a country that fears them. They take up the challenge willingly because they love their country, and no piece of paper or lack thereof changes that.

And while the script is funny, and our protagonists are part Elle Woods, part Romy & Michelle, the final scene is a sobering reminder that undocumented people make the best of the hand they are dealt and that the ultimate act of rebellion is to find a piece of JOY.



LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

My mom smuggled me out of my country with false documents to smuggle us into the US without any proper documentation or means to stay. But the world was different in the 1980s and our status was protected. We were given a path to citizenship. And even though my papers were sorted after my mother's were, I still noted the way that people treated us differently. I "sounded" like an American girl. She sounded like an immigrant with an accent -- I could more easily assimilate and no matter how hard she tried, she was still seen as a foreigner. I grew up knowing that if I sounded like everyone else, I could blend in and maybe be given the same opportunities as my peers. So I'm fascinated not just by assimilation and what it does to your psyche to deny a huge part of yourself, but also by the public perceptions of what an undocumented person is supposed to look like. The stories are all of heartbreak and poverty -- of disappointment and belonging. But who wants to recycle that trauma porn again? I'm more interested in challenging the accepted notions of identity and turning them on their heads. I want people to explore what they think makes someone else an "American" through the lens of an irreverent comedy that doesn't take itself too seriously. At the end of the day, Illegally Brown is about identity, family, and the lengths we'll go to for our piece of our American dream, no matter how shallow or selfish it might seem.











GABRIELA REVILLA LUGO Writer + Director + Producer

A dramedy feature/TV writer/director/producer and formerly undocumented immigrant, Gabby Revilla Lugo started her career in physical production then ventured into the independent feature space where she worked with names like Damian Chazelle on his award-winning film, Whiplash. She had success with films including the award-winning Palm Springs, The Starling, and Fox Searchlight's Next Goal Wins, written and directed by Taika Waititi. Gabby was staffed on ABC's hit drama, A Million Little Things, and teaches screenwriting at the Script Anatomy school.

In 2021 Gabby sold multiple podcasts and landed a feature film writing job for Mattel. She also sold 15 Candles, a TV pilot based on John Hughes' 16 Candles, to Peacock, alongside UCP and OJALA, which is led by award-winning playwright, Tanya Saracho. She worked on the TV series Brujas and completed the WGA's showrunner training program. Most recently she has been tapped as the creator of a racing drama with MGM International. Gabby has several TV projects in development, including one with 3PAS and Gina Rodriguez that is in negotiations with a major studio, and another for broadcast with AGC studios.




JESSICA OLTHOF Producer







