SHORT SYNOPSIS

Ingrid, a teenage girl who lives in a small town in Mexico, is helped by her best friend in her search for home remedies to stop an unwanted pregnancy, undeterred by the health risks that she may face. Together they discover that in spite of the vulnerable situations society places women in, sisterhood can help them flourish.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Around the entire world, people are still fighting for basic rights such as making choices over their own bodies. My short film "Cuanacaquilitl" (Dandelion), aims to keep having conversations about the dangerous conditions that thousands of people with a capacity for pregnancy face practicing clandestine abortions.

This film portrays, through a fiction scenario, the lives of many females around the world who lack the resources to decide over their own bodies but it's also a film that honors the power of hope, resilience and sisterhood.

"Cuanacaquilitl" comes from the Nahuatl language, venerating my roots and my ancestry, and it means "Dandelion" in English. This narrative short film is written in honor to my grandmothers who despite living in tough conditions, showed strength and resilience raising a large number of children, and it's dedicated to all the people with a capacity for pregnancy who feel overwhelmed during these uncertain times.

DIRECTOR'S BIO

LORENA R. VALENCIA is a Mexican filmmaker based in New York City. She holds an MFA in Film from the City College of New York and a BFA in Design and Visual Communication from the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM).

Her directorial debut and MFA thesis film Cuanacaquilitl (Dandelion, 2022) received the 2022 National Board of Review Student Award and is currently an Official Selection at various film festivals such as the Morelia International Film Festival (Mexico), Atlanta Film Festival (USA), and the Human Rights Arts & Film Festival (Australia). She is also a member of the New York Women in Film and TV organization (NYWIFT) and was a nominee for the 2021 BAFTA-NY Jeff Hunter Charitable Trust award as well as a recipient of the 2020 Dr. David M. Milch Foundation award and the 2021 Bert Saperstein Communication award.

Lorena is passionate about both narrative and documentary storytelling and is interested in addressing issues such as reproductive rights, identity and belonging, and motherhood. She is currently directing "Mi Ranchito," a documentary short film that explores the resilience and love of people in the countryside for their land, who choose to stay in their communities, seeing migration from a different perspective. Lorena is also developing her opera prima "Mayahuel," a narrative feature film that explores contemporary paganism and the benefits of ancestral knowledge associated with fertility and reproductive rights.

CAST

ABRIL MONTIEL (INGRID) is a Mexican actress born and raised in Huejutla, Hidalgo. She is currently studying a B.A. in Theater at the Autonomous University of the State of Hidalgo. She made her debut in films acting in the movie "Naran" (2018) directed by Nubia J. Saldaña after acting in theater for years including plays like "Bodas de sangre" (2018) Dir. Alex Sanmar and "Caricias" (2019). CUANACAQUILITL is her debut as a lead actress in a film.

ALEJANDRA HERRERA (BRENDA) is a Mexican actress nominated for Best Actress by the 2020 Tribeca Film Festival for her role as Marisol in "Kokoloko" directed by Gerardo Naranjo, film that also won the award as BEST MEXICAN FILM at the 2020 Guadalajara International Film Festival. Alejandra has played several roles in films like "Roma" (2018) by Alfonso Cuarón, "Spider mouth butterfly" (2020) directed by Alexis Moh, "La diosa del asfalto" (2020) directed by Julián Hernandez, "Tiempo de Iluvia" (2019) directed by Itandehui Jansen and "Yo Fausto" (2019) directed by Julio Berthely.

JESUS ISLAS AMBRIZ (MAN) is a Mexican Theater Director and actor. He holds a M.F.A. in Contemporary Art (2020) and a B.A. in Dramatic Arts (2007). Currently is Coordinator of the B.A. in Theater at the Autonomous University of the State of Hidalgo while teaching Staging in the same institution.

JOSÉ LUIS CASTILLA LEÓN (FATHER) was born and raised in Mexico and has spent over 25 years acting and directing theater. He is the Founder and Executive Director at Teatrubu, located in Tlaxcala. Jose Luis holds a M.F.A. in Mexican Literature for the BUAP and a B.A. in Performing Arts for the Universidad Veracruzana. He has played several roles in theater, TV and film including "Zapata Vive", "Mirada de Mujer" and "El Violin" (2005).
