A Cinematic love Letter

This project was born as Marianne grieved the loss of her uncle Ignacio, who died during the pandemic while she was unable to say her goodbyes. Ignacio was the younger brother of Marianne's father and one of four siblings who were raised between Belgium and Venezuela by world war II survivors who flew from Europe in the 1950s.

With many unanswered questions in mind, Marianne sat down with her father and invited him to dive into a family story that had felt off-limits until then. As she tries to make sense of the new findings –and with the help of hours of stock footage she gathered through a lifetime as the family videographer– she weaved this essay for the documentary Lab Noticias Desde Ninguna Parte.

The result is an honest, raw look into her family, the threads that bind them together, and the way that this has influenced her journey as a queer person.





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The goal now is to turn Dear Uncle into a feature that delves deeper into my family's history as I try to reconnect with Andy, my other uncle with whom I've never had a close relationship due to an issue I don't know much about because, as dad would say, "we just never talked about it" (either).




