

SYNOPSIS

HOMOLOGIES starts out as a seemingly straightforward family drama. An affluent couple is worried about their teenage son's behavior. There was a recent incident with a girl, conflict at school and with his sister. Quickly, however, we learn we are in the near future and in uncharted territory: a world in which Crispr technology is as commonplace as IVF, at least among the One Percent. Ambitious parents can pay for certain traits to be present in their children before they're born. The possibilities are endless…but so are the risks.

ABOUT THE FILMMAKERS

Bryerly Long - DIRECTOR / PRODUCER

Fluent in French, German, Japanese, Spanish and English, Bryerly Long is a filmmaker with a global perspective. She graduated with highest honors from the University of Oxford, where she served as a Committee Member in the prestigious Oxford University Dramatic Society.

Bryerly Long began her career as an actress in Japan. She starred in commercials, TV, theater and in several films by the Cannes-awarded director Koji FUKADA, and became the first actor in the world to act opposite a real android robot on stage and in the feature film "Sayonara" (2015).

Long made her film directing debut with "Tokyo Dreamers, a little violence", which premiered at New Filmmakers Los Angeles in 2020. She studied Screenwriting and Producing at UCLA on a full scholarship. In 2022, she completed her Masters in Directing at ESCAC (Barcelona).

Tatiana Blackington James - WRITER / PRODUCER

Tatiana Blackington James writes about the intersection of the personal and the political, with a particular fondness for spy stories. She has written screenplays on Mata Hari for Universal Pictures, Albert Einstein for HBO, and the award-winning films, THE NARROWS, and HOMOLOGIES. She recently adapted the novel, An Unexpected Guest, for British director John Strickland, and is developing a limited series on the writer, Anaïs Nin, with French director François Velle.

Tatiana is proud to serve on the Los Angeles Committee for Human Rights Watch and on the Advisory Board of the Glorya Kaufman School of Dance at USC.

Eric Oh, CSC, MYSC - DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY

With a career that spans the globe and success in film, television, commercials, and documentaries, Eric is a Full Member of the Canadian Society of Cinematographers (CSC) and an Accredited Member of the Malaysian Society of Cinematographers (MYSC).

Eric started his film career in Toronto, Canada where he first worked as a camera assistant while studying Film for his Bachelor of Fine Arts degree. After eight years as a camera assistant, he embarked on his cinematography career, beginning as a Steadicam operator. He quickly rose the ranks to Director of Photography, cutting his teeth on music videos and progressing to commercials, and finally feature films.

In 2008 Eric traveled to Bali, Indonesia to shoot a feature length documentary. Eric decided to stay in Asia, basing himself in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Eric worked throughout the region shooting documentaries and commercials in China, Thailand, Malaysia, Vietnam, Cambodia, Singapore, Japan, and Indonesia. He also launched a boutique documentary production company with two partners. Together they shot and produced documentaries for National Geographic Asia, Discovery Asia, History Channel, and Channel News Asia, as well as numerous other broadcasters.

In 2016, Eric relocated to Europe to develop narrative projects as both a producer and director of photography, splitting his time between Canadian and European projects. Since then, Eric has lensed five feature films, and has several projects in development.

Tim Seymour - COMPOSER

Tim Seymour is a composer and songwriter based in the New Forest, Hampshire, UK. In November 2022 Tim graduated from the European Academy of Fine Arts where he studied film and game scoring through the Film Scoring Academy of Europe. Tim has independently recorded and released music encompassing multiple different genres and his music has been placed in video games and other media. His orchestral music has received airplay on BBC Radio 3 and other online platforms.

Andy Hill - MUSIC SUPERVISOR

Since 2019 dean and director of studies of the Film Scoring Academy of Europe in Sofia, Bulgaria, Andy Hill is a 35-year veteran of the film and television music industry, former vice president of music production for Walt Disney Studios, Grammy Award-winning music supervisor, founder of the MFA program in Music Composition for the Screen at Columbia College Chicago, and author of Scoring The Screen: The Secret Language Of Film Music (Hal Leonard, June 2017). Films for which he served as executive in charge of music production have earned nine Academy Awards in music categories. Projects for which Andy served as music supervisor include Ed Wood, Message In A Bottle, and James and the Giant Peach. In his current role as dean of the Film Scoring Academy of Europe, he directs its M.F.A. program in Music for Motion Pictures and Contemporary Media.

In 2012, after five years directing the masters program at Columbia College, Andy was engaged to oversee the launch of the international MA in film scoring at Berklee College of Music, Valencia, Spain. He continued to teach and lecture in Europe for three years, and developed a "traveling classroom" for both aspiring media composers and filmmakers eager to learn how to more effectively employ music in cinematic storytelling. From 2015 to 2018,

Andy served as a visiting lecturer and industry advisor for the masters program in Scoring for Film and Visual Media at Pulse College, Dublin, and has lectured for the University of Edinburgh, HKU, and the University of Austria at Krems. He has been a regular presenter for Krakow's Film Music Festival and Jan Kaczmarek's Transatlantyk Festival in Poznan.
