Director's Statement

Tequila Sunset is a dark comedy-drama that explores the desires of an old Chinese woman. It's largely inspired by the relationship between my father, who has Alzheimer's, and my mother, who is his primary caregiver. Being the only child and currently away in the United States, my mother and I frequently chat over the phone, where she has often expressed stress and anxiety when it concerns my father's care. One particularly poignant exchange happened in September 2019 when my father just had a heart attack and my mother stayed by his side during the ambulance ride to the hospital. For a split second, she wished for him to die so that she would no longer need to care for him.

The responsibilities of a caregiver are exhausting and have overwhelmed and consumed my mother. However, as an elder woman, while she negotiates her responsibilities and peer pressure, she still yearns for a better life and future. *Tequila Sunset* is an ode to my mother, and to all women who struggle with the expected societal roles made for them against the vivacity and life still within them that is ready to burst at a moment's notice.



About the Director

JINSUI SONG is a writer-director and editor based in Los Angeles. She recently graduated from the MFA Directing program at UCLA and holds a BFA in Screenwriting from the Beijing Film Academy. Her work has been screened at the Cairo International Film Festival, CAAMFest, St. Louis International Film Festival, etc. Her latest film, Something Blue, supported by the Panavision New Filmmaker Program, is currently in post-production.

Growing up in Shenzhen, China, a metropolis situated in Guangdong Province, she struggled between traditional Cantonese values and modern aspirations. Her filmmaking style combines tragic comedy and comedic tragedy to explore the complexity of human experiences and emotions. She endeavors to create films about women, in particular Chinese/Chinese-American women, and the many facets of their womanhood.
