A privileged six-year-old Pakistani girl embarks on a mission to save her beloved pet goat from being eaten on the Muslim holiday of Eid al-Azha, only to learn the meaning of sacrifice.

#### **SYNOPSIS**

Iman, a privileged Pakistani girl, goes with her family to buy a goat, as is the tradition in Pakistan before the Muslim holiday of Eid al-Azha. She picks the cutest one, and takes it home. She spends all of her time with the goat, whom she names Barfi, after her favorite Pakistani dessert. Soon, however, she realizes that Barfi is not a pet, but a goat being raised for slaughter. She makes a plan to save Barfi's life before he can be sacrificed on Eid. Along the way, through the help of her family and friends, she learns the true meaning of sacrifice, and the reason behind Eid al-Azha.

#### Writer and Director

Mahnoor Euceph is a Pakistani-American writer and director. She immigrated to Los Angeles from Pakistan at age eight and quickly learned that nobody else cared about cricket. Mahnoor graduated Summa Cum Laude from UCLA in 2017. In 2021, she received her Master's of Fine Arts from USC's School of Cinematic Arts in Film and Television Production. During her MFA, she worked as Art Director on American Eid, Disney's first ever Muslim story. In November 2022, she was a fellow in the Islamic Scholarship Fund's inaugural Muslim Centered Writers' Lab with support from Extracurricular and The Black List, for her feature film, Queen of Diamonds. Her professional directorial debut, Eid Mubarak, won the Jury Award for Live Action Short at the New York International Children's Film Festival, making the film Oscar-qualifying. Mahnoor is interested in exploring entertaining stories about the South Asian diaspora through the female gaze. Her work is injected with humor and features a hyper stylized feminine sensibility informed by design and fine art. With her films, she seeks to decolonize the mind.



#### Producer

Multi-disciplinary Pakistani filmmaker Kamil Chima graduated from Harvard College in 2015.

He is best known for his debut feature film *Laal Kabootar* (2019), which he co-wrote and produced.

The film was Pakistan's Official Selection for the Academy Awards 2020 and played at Palm Springs International Film Festival.

Born and raised in Pakistan, but molded and shaped in college in the US, Kamil is at home in two worlds. Through *Eid Mubarak* he aspires to bring these two distinct worlds closer together. Kamil is currently signed on with Stage 13 (Warner Bros.) for his next project.

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
