Naoto Shibata as **Young Mehrdad**

Naoto Shibata is a non-professional actor from Tokyo, Japan. The Old Young Crow is his first film. His father is Iranian while his mother is Japanese. His favorite manga is Demon Slayer and he was 8 years old at the time of filming and is now in high school.

Hassan Shahbazi as **Old Mehrdad**

Hassan Shahbazi is a non-professional actor from Mashhad, Iran. He's a physician, surgeon, and nutritionist with a career that spans almost 70 years. The Old Young Crow is the second film he's made with his grandson, Liam LoPinto.

Keiko Yamashita as Chiyo Tashiro

Keiko Yamashita was born on July 1st, 1943 in Tokyo, Japan.After graduating Meijiza Academy, she joined R-Jeux Actor's Agency and since then she has been playing in different T.V. dramas, short films, and feature films as a supporting actor, such as "Hotel New Moon" (2019), "Plan 75" (2022), the TV Asahi drama Aibou (2020) and appeared in many CM and remake dramas in Japanese TV.

DIRECTORS STATEMENT

This film was born out of a major personal health and identity crisis while I was studying in Tokyo. I met Shohreh Golparian, who was Abbas Kiarostami's translator and assistant while he was making Like Someone in Love, his last narrative feature, in Japan. She's also the liaison and contact for many great Iranian directors who come to Japan like Mohsen Makhmalbaf and Amir Naderi. She introduced me to the retrospective that galvanized me to make the film. Those films are "The Runner," "Where is The Friend's House?," "Willow and Wind," and "The Mirror," I decided then to make a film about my time living and studying and working in Japan, as well as focusing on the Iranian diaspora in Japan. There was a really amazing experience of reconnecting with my own culture and diaspora through being in Japan. To see all these Japanese filmmakers appreciate the work of Iranian filmmakers made me feel really proud of my own heritage as a first-generation Iranian American with a mom from Mashhad. I originally wanted to study and make a film in Japan purely based off of my love for Japanese cinema. I felt like another Eastern culture was the only way to reunite myself with my own Eastern culture. By the time I started editing, I felt like I couldn't finish it. There was something that just completely disconnected when I went to animate and edit the footage. I didn't feel like I was the filmmaker and animator I needed to be in order to make the film. Nearly 6 years later after graduating CalArts for Character Animation, I went through another personal health crisis and in the act of just working as a means of therapy, I finished the film. In doing so, I confronted a lot of the issues of grief and memory and death and mental health that had existed on the road leading up to its completion. The film is a combination of animation and live action, both my trades, and an intersection of my family and journey involving grief. It's a mission statement of the kind of films I want to make, crossing mediums and cultures and languages in order to reconnect with my own.



DIRECTOR, Liam LoPinto

Liam LoPinto is a filmmaker and animator from New York City. He graduated from NYU Tisch's UGFTV program in 2017. He also studied at Waseda University in Tokyo and attended CalArts' Character Animation program from 2017-2021. His film French Fly was selected for CAA Moebius' 5th Showcase. His documentary "Karam Camera" was made in partnership with Karam Foundation focusing on empowering young Syrian refugees. He's a first generation Iranian-American and his work focuses on diaspora, refugees, immigrants, and dissidents.

His time in Japan led to his collaboration with Shohreh Golparian, an established liaison of Iranian filmmakers and talents in Japan as well as Abbas Kiarostami's assistant and translator for his last film, "Like Someone in Love." He wrote and directed his short in Japanese after attending Shohreh Golparian's retrospective for Iranian New Wave Cinema. He speaks Japanese and Farsi in addition to English. His film The Old Young Crow won the Best of Festival award at Palm Springs.



EXECUTIVE PRODUCER, Arian Moayed

Arian Moayed is an Iranian-American actor, screenwriter, and director. Moayed has received two Tony Award nominations for Best Featured Actor in a Play for his performances in *Bengal Tiger at the Baghdad Zoo* (2011) and *A Doll's House* (2023). He earned two Primetime Emmy Award nominations for his role as Stewy Hosseini in HBO's *Succession*.

EXECUTIVE PRODUCER, Scott Aharoni

Scott Aharoni is an American film producer and director. He is a co-Founder of The Curious Gremlin, an American independent entertainment company specializing in film and television development, production and financing. His film "Leylak" had its World Premiere at Tribeca Film Festival in 2021 where it won the Special Jury Prize. He was also an Executive Producer on the Oscar Shortlisted film, "Les Crimenels."

ASSOCIATE PRODUCER, Shohreh Golparian

Shohreh Golparian established her company Small Talk Inc. in 1999 in Japan, and since then has been producing, distributing and promoting of Middle East cinema specifically Iranian Cinema in Asia and other countries including documentaries, short films, and more than 13 co-production feature films such as Amir Naderi's "*CUT*" (2010) and production coordinator and Assistant to Director Abbas Kiarostami, in his last film "*Like Someone in Love*" (2012).









