SYNOPSIS

Struck with nostalgia for his childhood, a recent college graduate returns to his old elementary school. As he jounreys further into the school, he finds that he's not alone. A faceless stranger and a pale, sickly woman in all white follow him in what becomes a mad chase, and a physical manifestation of his greatest fears and anxieties about leaving home.

DIRECTORS STATEMENT

During the making of "My Child," I found myself in a very similar state as the protagonist of our film. A state of intense anxiety for the future, and longing for the past. Throughout college returning home always felt strange. Like putting on a shoe that you've outgrown. Every year my posters, books, and shelves would collect a thicker and thicker layer of dust. My childhood memories seem farther than they've ever been, like a past life that is slowly slipping away.

The creation of this film was my attempt to convey these feelings, shared by many young people as they become adults and leave home for the "real world." It was essential for me that I made this now, during the same stage in my life as my protagonist, with the same collective experience amongst all of my team.

I wanted to tell a very universal and poignant story in a cinematic and immersive way, utilizing purely visuals and sound to bring audiences into the protagonist's anxious state of mind. The monsters he encounters represent his own fears: of the future, adulthood, the passing of time and the loss of innocence.

I hope audiences can sympathize and relate to our protagonist and his mother, and come out of the film with a renewed sense of hope for what the future has to offer. And more importantly, with the inspiration to call their moms.
