SYNOPSIS

Black Magic is a traumedy that follows Alicia, a Black screenwriter, as she navigates her new staff writer position on a network drama. When she realizes that she's nothing more than a fellowship diversity hire, Alicia tries to prove her worth to a room that must write in a "diverse" character to save their show. The character quickly devolves into little more than a trope, forcing Alicia to either compromise her hard-earned dream job or play nice with her colleagues and compromise herself.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Black Magic was written during the height of the pandemic, where binge watching movies and TV shows turned into a game of spotting age-old stereotypes in some of the most popular shows. It was disheartening, to say the least, but curious how a trope like the magical negro could thrive in present day media. I began to imagine where this trope came from, and how it continues to persist. This film, for me, is a magical negro origin story. It's also a traumedy, where the main character is forced with an impossible decision at work and chooses as well as anyone might on their first day on the job. Through a dark and comedic lens, Black Magic explores the parallels between real perceptions and consequential misrepresentations of Black people. It attempts to illustrate the dangers of this popular depiction as well as draw a connection to the real world writers who – consciously or not – replicate it.

WRITER/DIRECTOR'S BIO

Cristin Stephens is a writer, director and producer from Philly. Generally speaking, her films explore unexpected intersections of black life. They bridge the comedic, off-putting, serious and sentimental, and center communities she loves. Her films have screened at festivals including San Francisco International Film Festival, New Orleans Film Festival, Cleveland International Film Festival, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and Shorts México, where she received a special jury mention for short doc MEN WHO TALK. She is currently touring her short film BLACK MAGIC and was named a 2024 top screenwriter to watch by Austin Film Festival and MovieMaker magazine. Cristin currently splits her time between Brooklyn, NY and Austin, TX.

PRODUCER'S BIO

Dana Reilly is a director/producer. Her films are intimate and collaborative, exploring how work, love, and family shape women's sense of self. Her short film, MS DIVA TRUCKER, premiered at Big Sky Documentary Film Festival in 2021, won the Jury Award at the PBS Shorts Festival and is currently available to stream on NoBudge.com. Her most recent film, FAVORITE DAUGHTER, screened globally at festivals including Telluride and DOC NYC, was picked up by MTV Documentary Films, and is currently streaming on Paramount+.

CINEMATOGRAPHER'S BIO

Carlos Estrada is a Mexican-American filmmaker based in Austin, Texas. He is a 2022 ASC Heritage Award nominee for his work as a cinematographer on EL FANTASMA. His work has been featured at EnergaCAMERIMAGE, PBS, NPR, Palm Springs, New Orleans, New York Latino Film Fest, and Film Shortage. His work in both fiction and documentary make him a versatile visual storyteller with a focus always on the emotions within the story.

COMPOSER'S BIO

William Jae is a composer and pianist raised in LA whose music can be described as both chaotic and sublime. In 2019, his string trio composition "Alabaster Wool" premiered at the Walt Disney Concert Hall and was performed by members of the Lyris Quartet. He received the Jack Kent Cooke Young Artists Award in 2020 and was the semi-finalist in the 2020 ASCAP Morton Gould Young Composers Award. William is pursuing a degree in music composition at the Eastman School of Music, where he is also the artistic director of the Eastman Chamber Orchestra.
