SYNOPSIS

When a script is unexpectedly switched, a dyslexic actor struggles to navigate his conservatory audition. Mixing the Greek myth of Chiron and the textures of off-off-Broadway theater, *All the Words on the Page* is an anxious tale about wrestling with an invisible disability.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I am dyslexic, as are my father and grandfather. Dyslexia is a subject seldom seen in cinema and no two cases are identical. Given this, I had to make clear the difficulties of dyslexia for the viewer. In addition to pulling from my lived experiences, I conducted research with Yale Online and the School of Education at William and Mary College to develop the character of Arlo.

Black-and-white 16mm film stock was selected to emphasize the layered performances of Maximilian Isaacs and Paul Lazar. The image's contrast expresses the doubt of dyslexia. The film's edit consists of images flipped around, fractured moments, and "shot-reverse-shot." These rhythms underscore the discomfort of the story.

This film is the labor of a terrific group of friends and collaborators. I hope this film makes dyslexia, an invisible disability, visible.

Hunter Gause is a Colorado-born and Brooklyn-based American filmmaker. His first narrative short film, *All the Words on the Page*, premiered in competition for Best U.S. Short at the 2024 Palm Springs International ShortFest before screening at Davey Fest, Pendance Film Festival, Fargo Film Festival, The Downtown Festival, and The Roxy Cinema New York. He's worked on the film and television sets of Gummy Films, Simone Films, and CBS. Before filmmaking, Hunter was an assistant theater director with New York Theatre Workshop, The Wooster Group, Big Dance Theater, and The Tank. As the son of a personal stylist and a sculptor, he's drawn to films about misfits, purpose, and artistic labor.

Nicolas Tepper is an Argentinian filmmaker, raised his whole life in Ecuador and living now in Brooklyn. His passion for film started with photography while traveling in Ecuador and finding how stories naturally came from people and places he met along the way. He works closely with directors on grounding and personalizing the story. Through his visual style, his work explores themes of identity, immigration, diaspora, disability, human connection and coming of age. His style focuses on blending looks from the classical era and auteur cinema from the '70s while embracing our present conditions and tools.

His narrative work has screened across festivals like Tribeca Film Festival, Palm Springs Shortfest, Frameline, Miami Film Festival, Bogoshorts, Cinelatino Reencontres du Toulouse, Nitehawk Shorts, Austin Film Festival, Pendance Film Festival, NoBudge Live.
