All political topics are intertwined and at it's core start with how we talk with one another.




DIRECTORS STATEMENT

What one creates is reflective of the period in which one creates it in. Spies In Corsets was a project born out of the 2023 WGA, SGA, & DGA strikes which heavily impacted me and my crew. Spies' was once reflective of many member and non-member debates regarding the contracts. Now in its release, it's reflective of the larger expression of separation amongst the American people in the face of a fascist administration. The same type of conversations between crew members a year ago are happening now between most American citizens; except instead of arguing about complying to demands of studio executives, it's auguring about whether to comply in an oligarchy.

I'm fascinated with how different perspectives, especially systemicly, shape conflict in our private conversations. Spies In Corsets is a reimagining of how these types of conversations could go when both the physical and emotional stakes are so entwined for the main characters. Political division is intrinsically a part of the queer experience and it's quickly becoming apparent that the patterns we perpetuate that enact political division, whether we are aware of it or not, start with how we arrive with each other. The short film isn't a blueprint for hard dialogue. This is purposeful to engage the audience in asking a different set of questions when engaging in this type of strenuous conversation.



DIRECTOR



JOEY J. HALEY (HE/SHE)

is a genderfluid Director, Steadicam operator & dancer from New Hampshire and Fortaleza, Brazil. He graduated from Mount Holyoke College with a BFA in dance. She studied in Prague for a semester at the Film and TV School of the Academy of Performing Arts in Prague (FAMU) and studied with a Sarah Lawrence College feature film program in 2019. Off the Air, a directed and choreographed interdisciplinary project, was showcased and won the "Best of Mount Holyoke" award in the Five College Film Festival (2019) and screened at the Massachusetts Multicultural Film Festival (2019).

In 2021, Joey won an "Excellence in Cinematography" award for Best Camera Motion in Smashed, presented by Cynthia Pusheck ASC. Joey operated Steadicam most notably for Lucia di Lammermoor at the LA Opera, Dorian Electra, Sinhead Hartnett, Decibel and She's the He. Joey is currently spearheading a Trans & NB centered Film Festival in Los Angeles. She's a award winning two time feature writer with both projects in development on an international scale.



CHLOE BALDWIN (HER/THEM/HIM)

is an award-winning American actor & stunt coordinator based out of Los Angeles. He graduated from conservatory training at The Theatre School at DePaul (Sarah Siddons Society Scholarship) and hit the ground running in Chicago, as Perdita in The Winter's Tale at Goodman Theater, as the titular Woman in Black in the first U.S. National Tour of the West End hit The Woman In Black, and on screen, most notably in Steve McQueen's film Widows, Amazon Studios' series Utopia and Shining Girls, and even on stunts for NBC's Chicago Fire.

She was featured in the recent Anheuser-Busch National "Let's Grab A Beer" spot and returned to Goodman to perform in Mary Zimmerman's Jeff-Nominated Ensemble of The Notebooks of Leonardo da Vinci before being cast as Dusty in Steppenwolf Theatre's POTUS, which was also nominated for a Jeff Award for Best Ensemble. Baldwin is also the executive producer & lead actor in the awardwinning fantasy short film "Morning is Broken" which won Second Place Overall at Seattle International Film Festival's SFFSFF and Best Fantasy Film at GenCon, the largest board game festival in the world.

Olivia Cade is a producer/director/
performer based in LA whose work centers
around highlighting dimensionality and
authenticity in queer narratives, playing
with genre expectations and dismantling
patriarchal film set practices. Olivia
was the creative producer for THAW
(Tribeca '23). She also produced and
helped shoot Books Across America, a
documentary about literacy that traversed
all 50 states. Along the way, she

interviewed literary dignitaries such as Joyce Carol Oates, the Librarian of Congress, Carla Hayden, and Ross Gay. Olivia also wrote, starred in and produced Give It To Me (Outfest '23, Atlanta Film Festival '23), a dark comedy that explored the healing power of kink between a sex worker and client. Currently, she is developing Lesbian Ditch Day (Screencraft Quarter Finalist '24), a meta-comedy about the discrepancy between curated queer content and standard straight film set environments.
