Daniel Solé [writer-director] is a filmmaker residing in Brooklyn, New York. His mockumentary shorts, "Brooklyn: For Real" received Virmeo's coveted Staff Pick award and made their Staff Favorites. He wrote two short films that premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival, "You Can Go" and "Gets Good Light", the first of which earned him the Best Writer Award at the NBC Universal Shorts Festival. He currently works as an in-house editor at Public Record.





Marlena Skrobe [producer] is a filmmaker with over eight years experience in commercial production, narrative, and documentary filmmaking. Marlena's most notable work in casting includes the 2018 Sundance NEXT Innovator Award winners We The Animals (Jeremiah Zagar), and Night Comes On (Jordana Spiro), casting for Theo Anthony's All Light, Everywhere, and most recently working as a talent scout for Brad Ingelsby's upcoming HBO Task Force limited series. Her 2021 documentary short, They Keep Quiet So We Make Noise, screened at festivals such as Palm Springs International ShortFest, Calgary International Film Festival, and won the Audience Award Winner for Best Short Film at Environmental Film Festival in the Nation's Capital (DCEFF). She recently produced Noëlle Gentile's directorial debut short, I Was Here.

Michael Polk [producer] is a producer and director based out of Cleveland, Ohio. In over a decade of filmmaking, he has directed a feature-length documentary, nine-part documentary series, and several narrative short films. Producing all of his own work, he is expanding his producing credits to help bring others' stories t o the world, including a feature-length horror drama, Countryside. Adam Chitayat [producer] is an American-Israeli filmmaker based in Brooklyn. As a director and editor, his work has been featured as a Vimeo Staff Pick, on Nowness, Directors Libray, and at the Tribeca Film Festival.

Growing up as the first generation child of immigrants, he found an avenue into the arts and a passion for storytelling at a young age, entertaining himself with films and music. He had a whole life in music as a drummer for about 10 years before becoming a filmmaker. In his freetime, he likes to research and test different vintage lenses. Matheus' work has played at multiple film festivals around the world such as SXSW, Tribeca Film Festival, Austin Film Festival, Hollyshorts, Cannes Court Metrage, as well as the MTV VMA Awards.
