



Synopsis

Harij, a newlywed, is eager for dowry gifts that never arrive, while his wife Sajili, trapped in an unwanted marriage, detests his insatiable appetite for intimacy. Harij, frustrated by her reluctance, enlists Leila, a bold and pragmatic sex worker, to "train" Sajili in "marital duties".

What begins as an unorthodox intervention, spirals into a sinister plot when Leila uncovers Harij's chilling plans for dowry-related murder. And Leila is no ordinary bystander. Viewed by society through a lens of stigma, she steps into the role of a protector. In a clever twist, Leila offers Sajili a dangerous escape—faking her suicide and framing Harij.

Can Sajili escape the patriarchal nightmare, claiming her independence, her hidden dowry, and her lover, leaving Harij and his greed exposed?

Background

Historically the dowry system in S.E. Asia was designed as safety net for brides and became, in some cases, a death trap. It's a form of domestic violence practiced around the Indian continent. A dowry death, or bride-burning typically occurs when a woman is murdered by her husband or his family for her family's refusal to pay the dowry or demands for additional dowry.

Brides are subjected to physical abuse, acid throwing, poisoning, strangulation, or forced into suicide.

Thousands of dowry murders and bride burning cases continue across India, Pakistan, and Bangladesh.



Director's Statement

Harij Weds Sajili uses dark comedy to confront the absurdity and brutality of the dowry system—a practice that continues to claim lives.

As an Indian, Angela's story—based on true events—deeply resonated with me. The sheer absurdity of a tradition that thrives in modern times called for a bold, unconventional approach. Dark comedy, though rare in Indian cinema, allowed us to explore this discomfoting reality while keeping the audience engaged.

We flip the script by making a sex worker the unlikely hero, challenging both moral hierarchies and gender norms.

This film isn't just a narrative—it's a bold, satirical lens on patriarchy, power, and societal hypocrisy.

Writer's/Producer's Statement

I was inspired to write this story after a potential arrest of a colleague's relative for dowry murder. When I learned of the tragic circumstances surrounding the bride's death, I began researching the frequency of dowry deaths and the contentious dowry system in S.E. Asia.

I felt it was critical to depict the harsh realities faced by women trapped within the confines of patriarchal traditions. *Harij weds Sajili* uses sharp satirical humor and delves into the complexities of marriage, societal norms, and personal freedom in modern India.





His latest short film, "The Golden Cage", qualified for the Academy Awards 2024.

Anshulika Kapoor is an award-winning actress, theater practitioner, and producer whose work centers around amplifying underrepresented South Asian voices. She has championed stories that challenge norms and spark conversations on identity, gender, and social justice. Her critically acclaimed films include *Golden Cage* (2024), an Oscar-qualified short that critiques corporate greed, *Just Another Day* (2022), which addresses gender-based violence, and *Mein Mehmood* (2023), a poignant take on immigration and language barriers—winner of the Golden Royal Bengal Tiger Award at KIFF.

Beyond film, Anshulika has left a mark on India's multilingual theatre scene with over 100 performances and made history as the first artist to present a street play on the TEDx platform. Her work continues to resonate globally, rooted in community yet universally relevant.

Executive Producer





He has appeared on Sky TV's *Sweetpea*, *Mr Big Stuff*, and *Changing Ends* for ITV, moving fluidly across all genres from comedy to drama. He also has several productions currently in pre and post production.

Nitin has worked alongside actors such as Johnny Depp, Aishwarya Rai, Om Puri, Anupam Kher, Donald Sutherland, and Ray Winstone. He is also an established artist and has held several exhibitions in central London.

He was awarded an OBE for his contribution to drama by the Royal Palace and is an ambassador for the King's British Asian Trust.



A Conversation With the Team

What drew you to tell a story like Harij Weds Sajili?

Angela Page: I felt it was critical to raise the issue of dowry murder to a broader audience. It seemed unfathomable that such cruelty and barbaric practices still existed. By putting a satiric spin on a real story may help resonate and shed light on the plight of some young brides in SE Asia.

A Conversation With the Team

What was it like working with an all-women producing team?

Prataya Saha: Empowering. Anshulika and Angela brought both compassion and clarity to the table. They were never just producers; they were co-storytellers. Their belief in the film, especially during moments of uncertainty, was what made it all possible.

What compelled you to do Harij Weds Sajili, and why now?

Anshulika Kapoor: For me, the film emerged from a deep recognition of the persistent and often normalized issues of gender violence and dowry practices that continue to impact South Asia. As an Actor /Producer I felt compelled to not only bring these realities to light but also, crucially, to celebrate the strength and agency of the women navigating them. Unfortunately these problems remain relevant today, and I believe nuanced storytelling has a powerful capacity to inspire meaningful change.

A Conversation With the Team

Was it difficult to find the right tone for a satire rooted in such a serious issue?

Prataya Saha: Absolutely. It's a tightrope walk. You can't trivialize the issue, but you also need to expose its ridiculousness. That's where the challenge lay—balancing entertainment with responsibility. It required deep conversations with the team, constant rework, and a lot of restraint.
